Where is the District Assembly 2010 being held?

- District Assembly 2010 is scheduled to be held at the Waynesboro Church of the Nazarene, 2959 Hermitage Road in Waynesboro, www.cfcnaz.net.

Why is this change being made?

- Change can be good. We are not changing, however, just to make a change. This change has been made specifically for 2010. No further decisions about 2011 have been made yet.
- We always hope to increase the participation at the District Assembly and Conventions and to do so specifically among the 20-30 year old age group. We do not want to diminish any age group's participation, but we do wish to have a well rounded representation at these leadership gatherings. One objective is an effort to create a broader measure of participation in the District Assembly by our young

promising leaders in local churches and their conversation with us about unified past and promising future.

- Most districts in the Church of the Nazarene make use of separate weeks for district assembly and campmeeting.
- Moving District Assembly to a new location was not a hastily made decision by the members of the District Advisory Board and district leadership.
- Because the assembly dates cooperate with the calendar of the General Superintendents, we work to accommodate their schedule.
- Moving Family Campmeeting to the new District Assembly date in July seemed unadvisable since the conventions and assembly would have taken most of the weekend time frame normally used for campmeeting.

How does this change affect Campmeeting?

- Separating Campmeeting and District Assembly can have a positive impact on Campmeeting as it allows us to expand Campmeeting and create new opportunities for activities and ministries.

What are the housing options for District Assembly 2010?

- There are a large number of hotels in the Waynesboro area. There are camping facilities nearby. Additionally, a large concentration of Nazarenes live in Waynesboro and the surrounding area and will not need overnight housing. More detailed information about housing options will be provided at a later date.

What are the costs for housing in Waynesboro?

- It is our hope to negotiate very favorable rates with local hotels. We expect the costs for housing to be the same or less than similar options that were available in Farmville/Appomattox.

Will District Assembly always be held in Waynesboro?

- We are only committed to this venue and this method for this one year. Future options for District Assembly include other locations on the district including the Virginia District Nazarene Camp.

What are the meal options at the new District Assembly 2010?

- There are many restaurants in the Waynesboro area, providing many options for meals. We will work with the local vendors to provide discounts to our delegates and friends.

Will there be childcare at District Assembly 2010?

- The Waynesboro Church will be partnering with our district leaders to provide child care to include nursery and toddler rooms with qualified staff/workers.

Will there activities for the children at District Assembly 2010?

- This item is still being determined, however, at this time children's activities will be limited to nursery and toddler childcare.

Who can attend District Assembly 2010?

- Delegates to the assembly, members of the assembly, guests. The events are open to the public.
